Most antiques that might come on the market probably date from the Tutor period and later. From 1500 to about 1650 oak was the timber most commonly used for furniture. Although often painted, few pieces bear traces of original decoration. Grander pieces of furniture were inlaid with arabesque patterns, occasionally on bone

5 or mother-of-pearl. However, carving is the most common form of decoration during this period and is usually a corruption of continental renaissance of mannerist motifs. The techniques of construction were comparatively simple. Furniture was usually paneled, and joints were secured by pegs.

The most common found pieces dating from this period are the simple oak chests used to contain linen. These have a hinged lid, a paneled front and sides within a simple pegged framework. Sometimes the panels were carved with patterns although often a mechanical feel to the carving betrays the 19th or 20th century improver's hand.
