- 3. How does an American writer demonstrate the national spirit in his works? Explain the so called "American spirit" by analyzing at least two works from writers like Benjamin Franklin, Mark Twain, Walt Whitman, Washington Irving, James Fenimore Cooper, Herman Melville, Nathaniel Hawthorne, and others.
- 4. Explain the role of gender in at least two novels. Compare and contrast the struggle of the female characters and the influence of the social milieu on their destiny. You can pick from Samuel Richardson's *Clarissa*, Charlotte Bronte's *Jane Eyre*, Thomas Hardy's *Tess of the D'urbervilles*, Hawthorne's *The Scarlet Letter*, Henry James's *The Portrait of a Lady*, Alice Walker's *The Color Purple*, and others.
- 5. How does a character reclaim the history and culture of his heritage in a literary work? Discuss the issue of identity in ethnic literature. Choose at least two works from the following writers: Maxine Hong Kingston, Amy Tan, David Henry Hwang, Iris Chang, Gish Jen, Jade Snow Wong, and others.
- 6. Define any two of the modern literary movements—realism, naturalism, symbolism, expressionism, the theatre of the absurd, epic theatre, and so on, and illustrate the ideas by using as least two literary works as examples.

#### IV. Anglo-American Literary Theory (40%)

- 1. Choose an author from English or American literature and discuss how he/she has been seen by critics during the past few decades. How have theories been brought in? (20%)
- 2. Choose a work from English or American literature and discuss critical theory's themes of "center" and "margin" embedded in it. (20%)
