- 2. Choose one novel and discuss its features that could be described as postmodern. 10%

The mail from Tunis, probably,

An easy Morning's Ride-"

A. Analyze a family tragedy from either the classical period or modern times.

Part Four: Literary Theory and Criticism (25%)

B. Discuss the gender issue in a play of your own choice.

- 1. One critic has said this about the Romantic Movement: "To the bourgeois, freedom is not the consciousness of necessity but the ignorance of it. He stands society on its head. To him the instincts are 'free,' and society everywhere puts them in chains. This is the reflection, not only of his revolt against feudal restrictions, but of capitalism's continual revolt against its own conditions, which at every step drives it forward to revolutionize its own base." Using this passage as reference, please briefly elaborate on the point of view behind. 13%
- 2. A famous psychoanalytic philosopher says this: "The fact is that the total form of the body by which the subject anticipates in a mirage the maturation of his power is given to him only as Gestalt, that is to say, in an exteriority in which this form is certainly more constituent than constituted, but in which it appears to him above all in a contrasting size that fixes it and in a symmetry that inverts it, in contrast with the turbulent movements that the subject feels are animating him." With a few sentences try to paraphrase this passage so its subject becomes clear to readers not familiar with psychoanalysis. 12%
