I. Identify the authors and the titles of the following passages: 20%

1. Once upon a midnight dreary, while I pondered, weak and weary,  
Over many a quaint and curious volume of forgotten lore,

As of some one gently rapping, rapping at my chamber door.  
“‘Tis some visiter,” I muttered, “tapping at my chamber door—  
Only this, and nothing more.”

2. I intend to build me a house which will surpass any on the main street in Concord in grandeur and luxury, as soon as it pleases me as much and will cost me no more than my present one. I thus found that the student who wishes for a shelter can obtain one for a lifetime at an expense not greater than the rent which he now pays annually. If I seem to boast more than is becoming, my excuse is that I brag for humanity rather than for myself; and my shortcomings and inconsistencies do not affect the truth of my statement.
