But if the study results are confirmed in future research, it could offer a new option for screening high-risk children before their symptoms become obvious—and possibly at a time when treatment will be most effective. The faster pattern of brain growth "is a potential biomarker that could be used to <u>18</u> those infants who perhaps could benefit from early stimulation," Dawson says. "This could help those children have the best outcomes."

Autism spectrum disorders—so called because they present a wide range, or spectrum, of different social and communication challenges—are often characterized by behaviors that include <u>19</u> motions or obsessions.
